Aims	To provide students with a foundation in legal institutions in English law as well as a general, non-specialist introduction to areas of English law that is particularly pertinent and relevant to accounting and finance. The student will gain a general knowledge of how the English legal system has evolved and will be introduced to key elements of English law including: basic contract law; agency law; the tort of negligence, and data protection. We will go on to study a number of different aspects of company law, including formation, administration, regulation, loan and capital financing. In addition we will consider insolvency and the criminal law as it relates to companies, including fraud, money-laundering and whistle-blowing.
